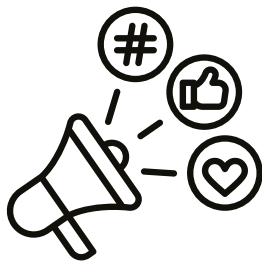

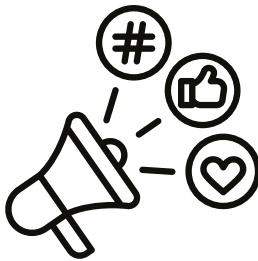

Section 1: Equality of Rights under the law shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or any state on account of sex. Section 2: The Congress shall have the power to enforce, by appropriate legislation, the provisions of this article. Section 3: This amendment shall take effect two years after the date of ratification

The ERA is Duly Ratified.

ERA passed Congress with the required two-thirds vote in 1972 and approved by the required three-fourths of the states in 2020.

The Congressional ERA Joint Resolution.

Recognizes ERA as valid and eliminates any arbitrary time limit since it was not included in what the states passed during the ratification process

Congress & the States Amend the Constitution.

The president and courts have no role in the amending process. Thus, the president cannot veto an ERA Joint Resolution.

ERA is needed now more than ever.

ERA is needed to stop the rollbacks and possibilities of further reversals on repro justice, employment, education, credit, sexual violence and more.

With ERA in the Constitution

Congress would have full authority to pass new laws that eliminate discrimination on emerging issues such AI, voting laws, health care research/treatment and more.

Without ERA

The Supreme Court could rule that Congress has no authority to end sex discrimination or may try to rule on questions about the arbitrary timeline.
